New wind and solar energy projects supported by Meta have been added to the grid in Ireland, ensuring our data centre electricity use is matched with 100% clean and renewable energy. This is part of over 723 megawatts of new clean and renewable energy added to local grids in Europe.

Operating Responsibly

- Our goal is to be water positive in 2030, where we will restore more water than we consume globally where Meta has owned operations. We have supported three water restoration projects in Ireland so far. Initial projects include protecting and restoring peatbog, stream restoration and wetland construction projects in the Liffey River watershed.
- Meta is committed to supporting the addition of new energy projects to the grid — this includes three projects in Ireland that are adding 219 megawatts of new clean and renewable energy, part of over 723 megawatts of new clean and renewable energy added to local grids in Europe. Meta matches all of its electricity use with 100% clean and renewable energy.
- Our operational data centre buildings achieve LEED® Gold certification by focusing on efficiency, sustainability and innovation.

Partnering with Meath

Meta is committed to being a good neighbour and community partner. We do this by supporting jobs and sourcing labour and materials locally where we can, participating in community and water restoration projects, and partnering with local chambers, small businesses and not-for-profit organisations.



Supporting local organisations

Meta supports the community through our annual Data Centre Community Action Grants programme providing direct funding for local nonprofits that support the community. Additionally, we bring our no-cost digital skills training workshops to Meath, helping small businesses and nonprofits grow their reach.

Community spotlight: Advancing STEAM learning

We provided over €500K in grants in 2023–2025 to support community partners delivering programmes in Meath focused on enhancing STEAM (Science, Technology, Engineering, Arts & Mathematics) education, including:

- Creating STEAM Meath with our partners Creative Hut. This is a fully funded programme for 11 primary and eight post-primary schools right across Meath — fostering STEAM capacity in schools through FIRST Lego League™. To date, this programme has supported more than 200 teachers to deliver over 50,000 hours of STEAM learning to 3,000+ students in Meath.
- Funding STEAM Team, a pilot initiative from Meath County Council and OurKidsCode that will help bridge the digital divide for students and their families in 20 schools in Meath. This community-based model of connecting families, children, and schools as one “STEAM Team” creates a space for people to learn together, and to support one another as they learn.



Operating Responsibly

We approach data centre sustainability from the ground up — from design and construction to operations — by prioritising energy efficiency, clean and renewable energy, water stewardship, and responsible management of equipment across our global fleet at end-of-life. The Clonee Data Centre also won Ireland’s Green Construction Award.



Net zero emissions goals

Our goal is to reach net zero emissions across our global value chain in 2030. Our data centres’ electricity use is matched with 100% clean and renewable energy through our strategy of adding additional renewables to the local grid, which also helps decarbonise the electricity system. In Ireland, this includes two new solar energy projects with Vantage RE in Meath and Wexford.



Water Stewardship

Our water stewardship programme is focused on increasing data centre water efficiency, supporting water restoration and conservation projects in watersheds where we have data centres, and being transparent with our water data. Meta has partnered with Microsoft and Google to support the restoration of 450 hectares of Irish peatlands through Peatland Finance Ireland. This €3M commitment will protect biodiversity, store carbon and safeguard water quality — restoring more than 21 million gallons of water annually!

The Clonee Data Centre prioritises on-site water efficiency by:

- Landscaping with native vegetation where possible.
- Incorporating water-saving fixtures and technologies within data centre facilities.
