Supporting local schools and nonprofits

We support the community through our annual Data Center Community Action Grants program and other direct funding for projects that put the power of technology to use for community benefit, give people the power to build strong, sustainable communities, and improve STEAM education.



Prioritizing sustainability

Meta approaches sustainability from the ground up — from design and construction to operations — by prioritizing energy efficiency and renewable energy, water stewardship, and responsibly managing the end of life of our equipment. Our operational data center buildings achieve LEED® Gold certification by focusing on efficiency, sustainability and innovation. We worked with multiple partners to meet our 100% clean and renewable energy goal for our operations in Texas, including the Fort Worth Data Center. This includes supporting nine new renewable energy projects in Texas.



Minimizing water use

We are proud to build some of the most sustainable data centers in the world and prioritize on-site water efficiency. The Fort Worth Data Center:

- Uses cooling technology that is significantly more water efficient than the industry standard.
- Reuses water numerous times before discharging it as wastewater.
- Is landscaped with native vegetation where possible to reduce irrigation demands.
- Captures and infiltrates rainwater on site.
- Utilizes water-saving fixtures and technologies within data center facilities.

Community spotlight

Since our Fort Worth Data Center became operational in 2017, we've supported organizations and projects that meet community needs, including:

- Fort Worth Museum of Science and History to enhance the children's museum exhibit by modernizing the technology and STEAM experience for students and families.
- Fort Worth Nature Center & Refuge for the expansion of the Marty Leonard Lotus Marsh Boardwalk, an outdoor community space that enables science and environmental education for all ages.
- The development of the National Juneteenth Museum, a state-of-the-art learning museum representing the global significance of freedom and the celebration of Juneteenth worldwide.
