Responsible energy and water use

Meta worked with multiple partners to plan for our energy needs and to ensure we are paying the full costs for the energy used by our data center, so consumers are not negatively impacted. Meta has also worked with the City of Fort Worth Water Department to pay the full cost of water and wastewater service for our data center. Our operational data center buildings achieve LEED® Gold certification by focusing on efficiency, sustainability and innovation.

Our goal is to be water positive in 2030, where we will restore more water than we consume globally where Meta has owned operations.



Clean and renewable energy

We are committed to supporting the addition of new energy projects to the grid — this includes more than 40 projects in Texas that are adding 9,000 megawatts of new clean and renewable energy. Meta matches all of its electricity use with 100% clean and renewable energy.

Partnering with Texas

Meta is committed to being a good neighbor and community partner. We do this by working with city and local partners to fund new critical infrastructure, such as roads, energy, water, wastewater and conservation projects, in addition to providing grants annually to support schools and nonprofits.



Workforce Development

Meta is investing in the workforce that's building America's digital infrastructure — starting with the communities where we live and work. That commitment includes America's Workforce Academy (AWA), a nationwide, unprecedented fast-track to a long-term career in a skilled trade. Powered by an initial \$115 million first-year investment, AWA is a cost-free program that supports all participants while they learn and then guarantees a job for all graduates. Graduates earn both the industry-recognized National Center for Construction Education and Research (NCCER) credential and an America's Workforce Certificate, both designed to travel with the worker across employers and industry sectors.



Water Stewardship

Our water stewardship program is focused on increasing data center water efficiency, supporting water restoration and conservation projects in watersheds where we have data centers, and being transparent with our water data.

The Fort Worth Data Center prioritizes on-site water efficiency by:

- Using cooling technology that is significantly more water efficient than the industry standard.
- Reusing water numerous times before discharging it as wastewater.
- Landscaping with native vegetation where possible to reduce irrigation demands.
- Capturing and infiltrating rainwater on site.
- Incorporating water-saving fixtures and technologies within data center facilities.

In the Trinity River Basin, we are supporting water projects led by local community partners, including:

- Litman Foundation
- Texan by Nature
- Texas Parks & Wildlife Department
- Upper Trinity Conservation Trust
