Responsible energy and water use

Meta worked with Rocky Mountain Power to plan for our energy needs and to ensure we are paying the full costs for the energy used by our data center, so consumers are not negatively impacted. Meta has also worked with Eagle Mountain City to pay the full cost of water and wastewater service for our data center. Our operational data center buildings achieve LEED® Gold certification by focusing on efficiency, sustainability and innovation.



Water stewardship

Our goal is to be water positive in 2030, where we will restore more water than we consume globally where Meta has owned operations.



Clean and renewable energy

We are committed to supporting the addition of new energy projects to the grid — this includes 13 projects in Utah that are adding 1,719 megawatts of new clean and renewable energy. Meta matches all of its electricity use with 100% clean and renewable energy.

Partnering with Utah

Meta is committed to being a good neighbor and community partner. We do this by working with city and local partners to fund new critical infrastructure, such as roads, energy, water, wastewater and conservation projects, in addition to providing grants annually to support schools and nonprofits.



Jobs to build and operate our data centers

We're committed to supporting local jobs in communities where we have data centers. Each data center building requires hundreds to thousands of skilled trade labor jobs to construct — steel workers, pipefitters, electricians, carpenters, fiber technicians and more. Once operational, each data center supports numerous jobs — electricians, HVAC specialists, server and network techs, and engineers — to run some of the world's most advanced data centers.



Workforce Development

We are driving America's Workforce Academy (AWA), a nationwide, cost-free, fast-track program to long-term career in a skilled trade powered by an initial \$115 million investment. Graduates earn both industry-recognized National Center for Construction Education and Research (NCCER) credentials and an America's Workforce Certificate, as well as a guaranteed job.



Supporting local organizations

Meta supports the community through The Future is for Everyone Fund, providing direct funding for local nonprofits that support the community. Additionally, we bring our no-cost digital skills training workshops to Eagle Mountain, helping small businesses and nonprofits grow their reach.

Community spotlight: Supporting Eagle Mountain's growing economy

Since our Eagle Mountain Data Center went online in 2021, we've supported organizations that meet community needs. For example, The Launch Pad Business Resource Center, designed to support Eagle Mountain's entrepreneurial community — more than 80% of the city's registered businesses are home-based. The facility provides incubator offices, co-working spaces, a social media lab, digital literacy center, podcast studio and prototyping workshop, giving local business owners the tools and space they need to scale.



Water Stewardship

Our water stewardship program is focused on increasing data center water efficiency, supporting water restoration and conservation projects in watersheds where we have data centers, and being transparent with our water data.

The Eagle Mountain Data Center prioritizes on-site water efficiency by:

- Using cooling technology that is significantly more water efficient than the industry standard.
- Reusing water numerous times before discharging it as wastewater.
- Landscaping with native vegetation where possible to reduce irrigation demands.
- Incorporating water-saving fixtures and technologies within data center facilities.

Our goal is to restore more water to local watersheds in Utah than we consume by supporting water restoration and conservation projects led by local community partners, including:

- June Sucker Recovery Implementation Program
- Springville Irrigation Company
- Trout Unlimited
